

#### On Christmas Reconciliation December 2019

At this season we remember a family who had to travel to their home town, in order to be counted by the government of the day. Thinking of Joseph, travelling with a heavily pregnant Mary I become aware of part of the Christmas story that I don't often focus on.

Joseph wouldn't be the first man to discover that his partner is pregnant and to know or think that it can't be his child she's carrying. I wonder whether his first feeling was hurt or humiliation, betrayal or anger. In a nativity story jam-packed full of angels and dreams, miracle babes, pilgim kings I don't always notice the miracle in Joseph's relationship with Mary. He doesn't leave her, he doesn't throw her out, he takes on both Mary and her child and I'm sure in the raising of that little boy, Jesus became his child as well as God's.

Men and women who are able to see through hurt and betrayal to repair and rebuild relationships; men and women who are able to love and raise children that are not in biological terms 'theirs' are very wonderful.

In the context of first century Palestine where society would have stoned Mary for adultery if Joseph had sought that this miracle of reconciliation between Mary and Joseph is perhaps even more amazing.

Reconciliation after hurt and disagreement whether between couples or friends; in families and communities is not often easy.

I wonder what kind of conversations Mary and Joseph had about all that had happened to them on the journey to Bethlehem. Even if I had an angel explain it all to me in a dream I know it would still have taken time and work to renew the relationship if I had been Joseph.

In a Christmas season when differences within the nation will have been discussed and pondered and voted on - I'm glad to be reminded by Joseph's part in the Christmas story that reconciliation across hurt an disagreement is not only possible, but often brings great joy.

May this Christmas season, and the new year that follows it, bring healing of hurts and the renewal of working well together for the benefit of all.

#### Defibrillator awareness course 14th November 2019 –

many thanks to everyone who attended the training course and also to the Tockenham Village Fair Committee for supporting the event from the funds raised at our 2019 Village Fair.

Please remember should you need to use the Village defibrillator our defibrillator box is locked- this is the code that unlocks the box C2589X If you make a mistake inputting the code just start again with C, pressing C resets the locking mechanism. You then need to turn the black button on the front of the box anti-clockwise. (We would be grateful if you could keep the code safely as we need to ensure the defibrillator is not at risk from vandalism or theft.)

In any medical emergency always call 999 first. The defibrillator is registered with the South Western Ambulance Service, however they will only advise you to go to the one at the Village Hall and give you the code if you are within a certain distance of it. If you have forgotten the code someone would have to go to the Hall dial 999 again for them to tell you the code to unlock the box.

If you are able to administer CPR you should do so, and it is advisable to call someone else to go and fetch the defibrillator.

Inside the cabinet the defibrillator is hanging on a hook. A pack behind the defibrillator containing mouth guard, scissors, razor (to shave hairy chests) disposable gloves, is also available for use.

The defibrillator is very simple to operate, just open it and follow the voice instructions.

Every time the defibrillator is opened it is a drain on the battery, so PLEASE only open in an emergency.

If you have reason to use it, it is essential you let us know so the pads can be replaced

#### TOCKENHAM PARISH COMMUNITY LOTTERY NEWS

Rosie, Ali and I want to share with you all how successful the Tockenham parish lottery has been since its conception in 2017. The primary aim of the lottery is to raise funds for use within the parish for the benefit of us all, and to those visiting the area. Anyone who has an invested interest in Tockenham parish can enter the parish lottery. Two cash draws are made each month at the village hall, culminating with the December grand cash prize draw.

Over the past three years the parish lottery has raised an amazing  $\pounds 4,020$  in total, generating approximately  $\pounds 2100$  for use within Tockenham parish. To date the money raised has gone towards the following:

Replacement of the existing flower tubs (and increasing their number), new soil and plants for summer and winter displays.

Defibrillator training for parishioners.

£750.00 towards the cost of a new storage facility for the summer fayre and parish park equipment.

Funds have been allocated to provide paint materials and equipment for the refurbishment of the parish park children's play apparatus in the Spring of 2020) and to replace one wooden picnic bench there.

ALL OF YOU has made this possible!!

At present the parish lottery fund has £300.00 available for use. We would like to hear your ideas for how it can be best used. Maybe those of you who reside in Tockenham Wick or at Tockenham Corner have the answer?
